Scope of Appropriation

This appropriation is limited to providing subsidy payments for eligible small retailers.

Intention Statement

This appropriation is intended to achieve support to retailers through providing subsidy payments for the delivery of provider products and services in accordance with the Retail Crime Subsidy Scheme.

Comment

To assist in the prevention of retail crime the Fog Cannon Subsidy Scheme (FCSS) was established in December 2022, to provide a subsidy of up to \$4,000 for small retail businesses such as dairies, bottle stores and service stations to have fog cannons installed.

This scheme went live on 1 February 2023 and is administered by MBIE. To receive the subsidy, retailers apply by completing an online application form and self-declare that they are eligible. Once the application is approved, retailers can engage with a range of suppliers from an MBIE-approved panel.

As at 30 June 2023 there were 24 providers on the FCSS panel providing nationwide installation coverage. To be selected for the panel, providers had to demonstrate financial solvency, adequate public liability insurance, appropriate registrations and the ability to provide a one-year warranty and service plan for their products. They also could not be subject to compliance action in MBIE jurisdictions (including WorkSafe).

As at 30 June 2023, 2,323 applications from retailers have been approved, with 1,011 fog cannons installed in retail premises.
